INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM. These include, amongst others resolutions relating to (i) the

renewal of the general mandate to issue securities of the Company; (ii) the renewal of the general mandate to repurchase Shares; and (iii) the re-election of retiring Directors.

This circular contains the explanatory statement in connection with the proposed resolutions for the approval of the renewal of the general mandates to issue securities and to repurchase Shares in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules and biographies of the retiring and re-electing Directors.

GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SECURITIES

At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to grant a general mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with securities of the Company not exceeding the sum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue at the date of passing such resolution and the aggregate nominal amount of the shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

At the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,376,000,000 Shares. Assuming only 469,000,000 new Shares to UTFE to satisfy the second tranche subscription under the subscription agreement (details of which are set out in Section 7 of Appendix I) and no other shares are issued or repurchased, the then total issued share capital of the Company at the date of AGM will comprise 2,845,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the resolution approving the general mandate and on the basis that other than the 469,000,000 shares to be issued to UTFE as stated in Section 7 of Appendix I no further Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the general mandate to allot, issue and otherwise deal with not exceeding 569,000,000 Shares, representing 20% of the total enlarged issued share capital of the Company.

As at the date of this circular, the conditions for the second tranche subscription (details as set out in Section 7 of Appendix I) have been fulfilled or waived, the Directors expect that 469,000,000 Shares, pursuant to the second tranche subscription, will be issued at the beginning of April 2006.

GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will also be proposed to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors. The explanatory statement, required by the GEM Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders, is set out in the Appendix I to this circular, which contains all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution for the Repurchase Mandate.

The Repurchase Mandate will expire whichever is the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the articles of association of the Company, or any applicable law of Cayman Islands to be held; and (c) the date on which the authority given is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders.

RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with Article 87 of the articles of association of the Company, Messrs. Cheng Kai Tuen, George, Wat Chi Ping, Isaac, Pu Rong Sheng and Chen Shu Quan shall retire from office at the conclusion of AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for reelection.

Brief biographical details of the retiring directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Notice of AGM is set out on 14 to 17 of this circular. A proxy form for use at the AGM is enclosed. PROCEDURE FOR DEMANDING A POLL

Pursuant to Articles 66 of the Company's articles of association, a resolution put to the vote at the AGM shall be decided on a show of hands unless (before or on the declaration of the results of the show of hands or on withdrawal of any other demand for a poll) a poll is demanded by:

- (a) by the chairman of AGM; or
- (b) by at least three Shareholders present in person or in the case of a Shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the AGM; or
- (c) by a Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or in the case of a Shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative or by proxy and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all Shareholders having the right to vote at the AGM; or

This is an explanatory statement given to all Shareholders relating to the resolution to be proposed at the AGM approving the Repurchase Mandate. This explanatory statement contains all the information required pursuant to Rule 13.08 of the GEM Listing Rules.

1. Exercise of the Repurchase Mandate

At the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,376,000,000 Shares. Assuming only 469,000,000 new Shares to UTFE to satisfy the second tranche subscription under the subscription agreement (details of which are set out in Section 7 below) and no other shares are issued or repurchased, the then total issued share capital of the Company at the date of AGM will comprise 2,845,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the resolution approving the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that other than the 469,000,000 shares to be issued to UTFE as stated in Section 7 below no further Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 284,500,000 Shares, representing 10% of the total enlarged issued share capital of the Company.

2. Reasons for Repurchases

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as it would enable the Directors to repurchase Shares in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchase will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

3. Funding of Repurchases

5. Undertaking of the Directors

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the power of the Company to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules, the memorandum and articles of association of the Company and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

6. Disclosure of Interest

On 1 February 2005, the Company entered into a subscription agreement with United Technologies Far East Limited ("UTFE"), pursuant to which UTFE will subscribe for new Shares in two tranches at a subscription price of HK\$0.577 per Share.

First tranche

On 12 April 2005, the Company has issued 356,000,000 shares to UTFE upon completion of the first tranche subscription, which represented 14.98% of the Company's enlarged issued share capital.

Second tranche

UTFE will hold another 16.49% of the enlarged issued share capital of the Company after completion of the second tranche subscription. The new Shares will be issued, subject to the conditions for the second tranche subscription being fulfilled

or waived (as the case may be), on the earlier of (a) the seventh business day after a notice in writing served by the Company on UTFE during the period, commencing from the date following six months after completion of the first tranche subscription, requiring to proceed with the second tranche subscription and (b) the first anniversary of the completion of the first tranche subscription.

As at the date of this circular, all conditions for the second tranche subscription have been fulfilled or waived, the Directors expect that 469,000,000 Shares, pursuant to the second tranche subscription, will be issued at the beginning of April 2006.

So far as the Directors are aware, on the basis that there is no alternation in the Company's issued share capital other than UTFE's subscription, the following table sets out shareholding structure of the Company after completion of the second tranche subscription pursuant to the subscription agreement dated 1 February 2005:

Their aggregate shareholdings are 63.76% of the enlarged issued share capital upon completion of the second tranche subscription (assuming there is no other change in the share capital structure).

By virtue of the arrangements contemplated under the subscription agreement and an option agreement entered into between Mr. Jiang and UTFE (pursuant to which Mr. Jiang grant an option to UTFE which when exercised would require Mr. Jiang to sell to UTFE certain number of shares at an exercise price as stipulated in the option agreement), Mr. Jiang, Mr. Jiang Qing (Mr. Jiang's brother) and UTFE are persons acting in concert under the Takeovers Code. Upon completion of the first tranche subscription, taken together, they hold 56.61% of the Company's voting rights and therefore are required to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. Mr. Jiang and UTFE has jointly applied to the executive directors

of the Corporate Finance Division of the Securities and Futures Commission (the "Executive") for a Whitewash Waiver in respect of the obligations either or both of UTFE and Mr. Jiang to make a general mandatory offer. The Executive has agreed to grant the Whitewash Waiver which was approved by the independent Shareholders by way of a poll at the extraordinary general meeting of the Company held on 29 March 2005.

Reference is also made to the Company's circular dated 10 March 2005. The maximum potential shareholdings of UTFE, Mr. Jiang and Mr. Jiang Qing in the Company exceed and will in aggregate exceed 52% of the voting rights in the Company and they may increase their shareholdings without incurring any further obligation under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code to make a general offer. Therefore, so far as the Directors are aware, no shareholder or a group of shareholders acting in concert who may become obliged to make such mandatory offer in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full.

However, as mentioned in the Company's circular dated 10 March 2005, UTFE has undertaken to the executive director of the Corporate Finance Division of the SFC that in the event that it exercises the option granted by Mr. Jiang pursuant to an option agreement dated 1 February 2005 between UTFE and Mr. Jiang and acquires the Shares from Mr. Jiang pursuant thereto, it will at the time of such acquisition make a general offer for the Shares in compliance with the Takeovers Code.

Details of the above-mentioned option agreement and the subscription agreement both dated 1 February 2005 are set out in the Company's announcement and circular dated 2 February 2005 and 10 March 2005 respectively.

8. Share Purchase Made by the Company

No repurchases of Shares have been made by the Company during the six months preceding the date of this circular, whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise.

APPENDIX II BIOGRAPHIES OF RETIRING AND RE-ELECTING DIRECTORS

Mr. Cheng Kai Tuen, George, aged 47, was appointed a non-executive director of the Company on 21 June 2005. He is the Finance Director of Chubb Asia, a business division of UTC Fire & Security. He holds a Master degree in International Management from American Graduate School of International Management. He is a director of various private companies under Chubb Asia but did not hold any directorship in any listed public companies in the last 3 years other than in the Company.

No service agreement has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Cheng. Mr. Cheng has no fixed service terms but are subject to retirement by rotation according to the Company's articles of association. He is not entitled to directors' emoluments of any kind at the current stage. However, should it be considered appropriate in the future, his emoluments will be subject to review of the Board with reference to the then prevailing market conditions. Further announcement will be made if Mr. Cheng's service terms and remuneration package are changed. Except that Mr. Cheng is an employee of a related company of United Technologies Far East Limited, a substantial shareholder holding 14.98% of the Company's issued share capital, he has no relationship with other directors, senior management, management shareholders, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholder of the Company. Mr. Cheng has no interests in shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Wat Chi Ping, Isaac, aged 33, was appointed a non-executive director of the Company on 21 June 2005. He is the Legal Counsel of Chubb Asia. He is admitted as a Solicitor of the High Court of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and a Solicitor of the Supreme Court of England and Wales. Mr. Wat did not hold any directorship in any listed public companies in the last 3 years other than in the Company.

No service agreement has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Wat. Mr. Wat has no fixed service terms but are subject to retirement by rotation according to the Company's articles of association. He is not entitled to directors' emoluments of any kind at the current stage. Further announcement will be made if Mr. Wat's service terms and remuneration package are changed. However, should it be considered appropriate in the future, his emoluments will be subject to review of the Board with reference to the then prevailing market conditions. Except that Mr. Wat is an employee of a related company of United Technologies Far East Limited, a substantial shareholder holding 14.98% of the Company's issued share capital, he has no relationship with other directors, senior management, management shareholders, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholder of the Company. Mr. Wat has no interests in shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

APPENDIX II BIOGRAPHIES OF RETIRING AND RE-ELECTING DIRECTORS

Mr. Pu Rong Sheng, aged 63, was appointed an independent non-executive director of the Company on 22 September 2005. He is a graduate of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering of the Beijing University of Technology. Mr. Pu has almost 40 years of working experience in the Fire Prevention and Fighting Bureau, and was a Senior Colonel of Armed Police Professionals (武警專業技術大校), working in the Fire Prevention Monitoring Division of the Fire Prevention and Fighting Bureau, and the Beijing Public Security Bureau (北京市公安局消防局防火監督部) before he retired in 1999. He is a qualified engineer in the PRC and is appointed a committee member and an expert of the Intelligent Engineering Branch of China Exploration and Design Association (中國勘察設計協會工程智能設計分會個人理事及建築智能化技術專家). He is also a member of the Construction Engineering Intelligence Experts Committee of the Ministry of Construction (建設部建築智能化技術專家委員會專家).

The term of office of Mr. Pu is from 22 September 2005 up to his retirement by rotation in accordance with the Company's articles of association. The director's emoluments, which are determined based on the estimated time to be spent by Mr. Pu on the Company's matters, are HK\$100,000 per annum. Mr. Pu has confirmed his independency pursuant to Rule 5.09 of the GEM Listing Rules. He has no interest in the shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of SFO and is not a connected person of the Company as defined in the GEM Listing Rules. Mr. Pu has no relationship with other directors, senior management, management shareholders, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company. Apart from the Company, Mr. Pu did not hold any directorship in listed public companies in the last 3 years.

Mr. Chen Shu Quan, aged 61, was appointed an executive director of the Company on 30 September 2002. He is responsible for the overall administration of the Group. Mr. Chen joined the Group in January 1997 and has over 10 years of administration and management experience in Fujian governmental entities. Before joining the Group, he was the vice director (副局長) of Department Affairs Administration Office of Fujian Provincial Government (福建省政府機關事務管理局省政府辦公廳) from 1986 to 1997 and was mainly responsible for the planning, management and administration affairs of government properties.

Pursuant to the service contract entered into on 30 September 2002, Mr. Chen is entitled to an annual salary of HK\$390,000 and discretionary bonus calculated on the basis of performance of the Group but in any event the discretionary bonus for all executive Directors shall not exceed 10% of the audited consolidated net profit after taxation and minority interests but before extraordinary and exception items of the Group for that financial year. The service contract was expired on 30 September 2005 but the terms of the contract remain in full force until a new contract is entered into or is terminated by Mr. Chen in accordance with the contract. For the year ended 31 December 2005, Mr. Chen's total remuneration was approximately RMB1,460,000. Apart from the options granted to him pursuant to the Company's share option scheme adopted on 20 September 2002 (details as shown below), Mr. Chen has no interests in shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.
